SENIOR ASSESSMENT WEEK AND YEAR 10 EXAMS

As parents/caregivers of students with upcoming exams, there are a number of ways you can support your child to achieve:

- · Spend time with your child to create a study plan.
- · Encourage them to study at times in the day when they are most motivated, such as the morning on a weekend, or early evening.
- · Create a quiet space at home for your child to study which has good lighting, a desk or table, and is away from distractions.
- · Have a conversation with your child every day about their studies ask them to share a highlight, the best thing about their day, show an interest.
- · Ensure your child balances school work with their other activities (e.g. sports, cultural, social activities, TV, phone, and/or social media time)
- · Ensure they get enough sleep at night. Studying is tiring, and combined with increased sleep requirements of teenagers, means they may need up to 12 hours each night in order to perform at their best! Good Luck.

NZQA FEES

All students who are entered for any NCEA standards are require to pay \$76.70. This fee is substantially reduced if you are eligible for financial assistance. **All fees must be paid before Thursday 1 September 2016.** Please consider paying this fee in instalments starting now so that all money is received by the due date. If paying by automatic payment or through internet banking please use the Reference: NZQA, and Code: students name.

Financial Assistance Forms are available from the Student Services Centre or can be downloaded from the NZQA website www.nzqa.govt.nz. These are due at the school off by Thursday 1 September.

These are NZQA deadlines and ones which cannot be altered by One Tree Hill College. Any students who have not paid their NZQA fees by Thursday 1 September will incur significant penalty charges for being late.

These penalty charges will add at least an extra \$150 onto your child's fees.
