



Principal's Message



Dear Parents and Caregivers

I am pleased to be able to inform our community of our excellent 2016 NCEA results which have now been confirmed by NZQA:

NCEA Level 1	87%
NCEA Level 2	89%
NCEA Level 3	89%

Based upon these results, consultation with the various sectors in the school community, and the analysis of student achievement data, we have set four major targets for 2017. These targets give us a focus in particular areas that we have identified as keys to student success. These are:



- 1. Raising Student Achievement** - We will use data, structures, and teaching strategies effectively to raise the achievement of all students. Key targets are to increase NCEA Level 1, 2 and 3 Achievement to 90%, and to increase University Entrance Achievement to 65%.
- 2. Increasing the Effective Use of E-Learning to Enhance Teaching and Learning** - We will increase the use of ICT to enhance student engagement and academic achievement (BYOD).
- 3. Implementing Positive Behaviour For Learning (PB4L)** - We will focus on creating a learning culture of excellence to increase student engagement and achievement – “STRIVE @ OTHC”
- 4. Establishing the Maungakiekie Community of Learning (MaCoL)** - We will focus on establishing the MaCoL and creating strong links across schools to strengthen pedagogy and student achievement.

The weeks beginning 29 May and 5 June are senior assessment weeks. A fortnight period in which all senior students are schedule to complete assessments which count towards their final NCEA grades. All senior students must attend school for the duration of assessment weeks as per normal (juniors also continue as per normal during this period). Please discuss with your child their study requirements during this period and remind them that the college's Homework Centre is open every day until 4:30pm. I would also like to ask all families to help their children by providing them with a quiet place in the home in which they can study and be prepared for these important assessments. In so many cases these upcoming examinations and assessments will prove essential for your child to achieve their NCEA this year.

Finally, thank you to those parents and caregivers who provided the Board of Trustees with valuable feedback, to be considered during the strategic planning process for the college, at the recent Parent Teacher Interview Day.
