Principal's Message



Dear Parents and Caregivers

As you are aware, One Tree Hill College continues to go from strength to strength and is now the school of choice for most families living in our community. One of the key foundations for our success is the strong strategic planning completed by the Board of Trustees over the past 15 years. This planning has always been based upon the needs of our community, following extensive consultation processes which have gathered feedback from all our stakeholders. It will be a similar process this time as well. Over the next 3 months, you will be given the opportunity to provide us with your feedback about the direction of the college in various forums. I strongly encourage you to engage in this process.

On Tuesday evening we held a Pasifika Fono to listen to the voices of our Pasifika families. Of particular note were the many new families to our whānau this year who were so complimentary of the direction of the college. There was also a strong group of parents who are wanting to engage further with the Board of Trustees in developing the best outcomes possible for all Pasifika students. This is very exciting.

On Tuesday 4 August we will be holding a Māori Advisory Meeting in the Knowledge Centre

at 6pm. The focus of this meeting is to look at how we can best support, and create successful outcomes, for our Māori students. These discussions will also feed into the Board's strategic planning process. I strongly encourage our Māori whānau to attend. A light meal and refreshments will be served.

Due to the lockdown disruptions earlier in the year, there are some senior students completing NCEA whose progress is not at the levels normally expected at this time of year. We have put strategies in place to support these students 'catch-up' on work missed. One of the most important strategies, is a special Senior Parent Teacher interview afternoon on Thursday 13 August from 1.30pm to 5:30pm. These interviews are only for families of senior students whose progress is not at expected levels and are therefore at risk of not achieving their NCEA. Families required to be involved in these interviews have already been emailed information about how to make bookings with their child's teachers. I wish to stress how critical attending these interviews will be for the success of their child this year. The focus of the afternoon will be the development of an individual learning plan for the remainder of the school year for each student to support them to gain their respective NCEA. If you have questions about this afternoon, please contact the reception.

To accommodate these interviews, I wish to advise that Year 10 - 13 students will be finishing school at the earlier time of 1.10pm on Thursday 13 August. No school buses will be operating at this earlier time. Please ensure that adequate arrangements are made for your child to get home safely. Year 9 students, along with Year 12 and 13 Drama students, will remain at school to attend a performance of Othello. They will finish school at 2:30pm. We have arranged for buses to collect Year 9 students at this time.

STUDENT PUNCTUALITY

A reminder that for the remainder of the year, learning will commence at 8:45am every day, except Tuesday. On Tuesday, learning will commence at 9:15am. All students will go straight to their period 1 class at this time. Whanau time will now be at the end of period 1. I strongly encourage all students to arrive at school at least 5 minutes earlier than required to avoid being late. A copy of the new bell times is attached for your reference.

Students arriving to school late without a valid excuse will be issued with lunchtime supervised service. If lateness persists, then after school supervised services will be issued.
