Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Caregivers



I would firstly like to acknowledge all the mothers, grandmothers and great grandmothers who do so much to support their children. I hope you all enjoyed a wonderful Mother's Day on the weekend.

Last week we held one of our biggest school events of the year – the annual Year 9 Citizenship fieldtrip to Maungakiekie (One Tree Hill). It was an amazing day watching our students connect with our maunga (mountain) that has such historical significance for Māori, and the great chief, Kiwi Tamaki. It has also been a central focus of our school's crest for over 67 years. Students completed a range of activities exploring the significance of Maungakiekie to the people of Auckland, climbed to the summit, and visited the Stardome. This week all Year 9 students will complete the OTHC Citizenship



course and will be presented with their 2022 Citizenship Badge to proudly wear on their uniform.

Year 9 and Year 10 Weekly Engagement Reports have commenced. Every Friday afternoon all Year 9 and Year 10 parents/caregivers will receive via email their child's Weekly Engagement Report which provides weekly feedback on engagement and attendance. We have received a lot of positive feedback about these new reports and the instant feedback it provides families.

A reminder that tomorrow we hold our Achievement Interviews (previously called parent/teacher interviews).
