In Zone Enrolments

All in zone students must apply for enrolment by submission of a fully completed online enrolment form and all required supplementary documentation <u>and</u> attend an interview on our special enrolment days on Wednesday 21 or Thursday 22 June 2023, 8am to 7pm. No appointments are required. All students must be with their parents/guardians and bring proof of ID (passport or birth certificate), latest school report and original proof of address (utility bill - power, water, rates are the only accepted proof of address)

Out of Zone Enrolments

All out of zone students for 2024 must apply for enrolment by submission of a fully completed online enrolment form and all required supplementary documentation. No interview is required at this stage. The last day for out of zone online enrolments is Wednesday 30 August 2023. All out of zone enrolments are provisional until the ballot takes place on Wednesday 6 September 2023. All families will be contacted regarding the outcome of the ballot process.
