Dear Parents and Caregivers

I would like to start by paying tribute to a former teacher at One Tree Hill College who passed away last week. Mr Fa'afetai Amituana'i was a much-loved and respected art teacher and mentor to many students since he began in 2008. There were many very touching tributes to Mr Amituana'i shared at his memorial service, but it was the One Tree Hill College Haka performed by some of his former students that made the biggest impact. Mr Amituana'i had been seriously unwell for the last 18 months and we know that he is now resting in peace. I have conveyed our deepest sympathy and condolences to his family on behalf of our school community.


