Dear Parents and Caregivers

Last week our boys chorale and girls choir performed at the Big Sing competition at the Auckland Town Hall. They were both outstanding. The musical talent at the college is phenomenal. Yesterday, I was informed that our boys chorale, Esquire, have been selected to perform at Cadenza - a special event in Rotorua where the best choirs in NZ are selected to perform. This is an incredible achievement. My congratulations to all students.



Recently we also celebrated National Pride Week. This annual event serves as a powerful reminder of the importance of acceptance, diversity, and love. It brings together individuals, organizations,

OTHC 2024 YEAR 9 ENROLMENTS

All enrolments for 2024 will be governed under an enrolment scheme. Please refer to our website for more details and a map of the One Tree Hill College zone. The online enrolment form can be located on our website under 'Enrol Now'.

In Zone Enrolments:

All in zone students must apply for enrolment by submission of a fully completed online enrolment form and all required supplementary documentation <u>and</u> attend an interview as soon as possible. Please make an appointment by contacting the college. All students must be with their parents/guardians and bring proof of ID (passport or birth certificate), latest school report and original proof of address (utility bill - power, water, rates are the only accepted proof of address) to eth interview.

Out of Zone Enrolments:

All out of zone students for 2024 must apply for enrolment by submission of a fully completed online enrolment form and all required supplementary documentation. No interview is required at this stage. The last day for out of zone online enrolments is Wednesday 30 August 2023. All out of zone enrolments are provisional until the ballot takes place on Wednesday 6 September 2023. All families will be contacted regarding the outcome of the ballot process.

UNIFORM REFRESH

Over the last 2 terms, a refresh of the One Tree Hill College school uniform has been taking place. This has included a review of our uniform provider. We are proud to inform our community that from 1 July 2023 our uniform will be supplied by SAS – it will no longer be sold at the Warehouse. For the next few months, our uniform will be available for purchase from The Uniform Shoppe in Manukau (1 Ronwood Ave, phone 092676063). This is SAS's retail outlet. It is open weekdays and Saturdays. For the convenience of our community, SAS will be opening a new store close to the college by the end of the year.

There was strong support from parents and students in the feedback collected in February 2023 to maintain the current colour and look of the school uniform with some adjustments to a few items. Parents told us that the retail service and uniform quality was important to them and SAS are able to address both of these aspects. We also are pleased that SAS will be able to maintain current item pricing for standard uniform items. Parents should be assured that there will be a transition to the refreshed uniform items over the next few years and all current items will be able to be worn until the end of 2026. We do not expect parents to be purchasing new items for students where they have existing items.

The refreshed uniform will be more modern in style and use fabrics which wear well and provide comfort to students. At the start of term 2, students will be asked to provide feedback on the proposed 'refreshed' uniform. Updates will continue to be provided, including a catalogue of uniform items once they are confirmed.
