INTERNATIONAL STUDENT HOMESTAYS WANTED

We have many new students arriving at the end of January 2024 to start the new academic year. They all need a great homestay family.

If you enjoy teenagers, have a spare room (single room with a bed, desk, storage for clothes), can provide 3 meals a day, can do laundry, and preferably live within walking distance to school or on a bus route passing the school, we would love to hear from you. As well as the enjoyment of hosting an International Student, host families receive \$340 per week.

Commitments do not have to be for a whole year. As well as whole year enrolments we also have students coming for shorter periods of time (2, 6, 10, or 20 weeks). YEAR 9 AND 10 EXAMINATIONS

All Year 9 and 10 students will sit examinations in Mathematics, English and Science on Friday 17 and Monday 20 November. Students have been informed about the general content of their examinations and should be studying at home in preparation for these. The exam timetable is attached. Some general instructions for students are:

- 1. Full school uniform must be worn at all times in all assessments.
- 2. The examination timetable will be emailed to all students. It will also be on the whiteboard outside the Student Services Centre as a reminder.
- 3. Students must bring all the equipment that their teachers have told them to bring. Pencil cases and calculator cases must be left in their bag at the front of the room.
- 4. Pens, pencils etc. must be in a clear plastic bag no pencil cases are allowed.
- 5. Dictionaries and electronic translators are not permitted (unless they have been allowed by their teacher).
- 6. Mobile phones and watches must be turned off and left in bags at the front of the room.
- 7. Eating, talking and sharing equipment (pens, rulers, calculators etc.) is not permitted. This includes when walking into the assessment room.
- 8. Failure to follow examination rules may result in a Not Achieved grade being recorded.
- 9. Students must stay in the room until the end of the assessment/exam they may not leave early.
- 10. If students are sick and unable to come to school for an assessment/exam, parents/caregivers must phone the school attendance officer.
