# **College Sport App**

# **Punctuality to School**

A reminder to all families that school starts at 8.45am every day. Students must report to the Attendance Officer if they are late to school. Every minute late, is a learning opportunity lost.

# **Absence from School**

Parents are asked to phone the Attendance Officer (579 5049 ext 846) first thing in the morning once they know their son/daughter will not be attending school that day. Please provide your son/daughter's full name, year level and reason for absence, along with a contact name and telephone number. After an absence, students must bring a note stating the number of days and the reason for the absence. This note must be signed by a parent or caregiver and be given to the whanau teacher even if there has already been phone contact.

### Leaving the School Grounds

Students must remain on the school grounds throughout the day, unless granted a pass from the Attendance Officer. This requires a note from home or written permission from a Whanau Leader.

### Sickness

A student who needs medical attention while at school should report to the School Nurse located in the Student Services Centre. Parents will be contacted by the School Nurse to collect sick students from school.

### **School Donation and Subject Fees**

Thank you to all families who have paid these. If you are unsure of your child's outstanding balance please contact the college for an updated statement. Please remember that the college counts on you paying these amounts to ensure it can provide the best learning opportunities and facilities for your children. It is appreciated if payments could be paid to the college reception as soon as possible. Payment of subject fees is compulsory.
