#### **General Information**

- 1. All details of the applicant will be dealt with in the strictest confidence.
- 2. Two levels of scholarships will be awarded -
  - 'A' Level scholarships have a value of \$1000 and can be used for educational purposes for as long as the student is enrolled at One Tree Hill College
  - 'B' Level scholarships will pay for the value of subject and material fees to a maximum value of \$100 and school fees for their first year of enrolment at One Tree Hill College
- 3. A short list of students will occur and an interview with the applicants and their families will follow. Notification of the time and date of the interview will be in writing.
- 4. Consideration will be given to learning attitudes, academic ability, involvement in extracurricular activities and any special family circumstances when awarding scholarships.
- 5. Successful scholarship recipients will be notified in writing within 2 weeks of the interviews being completed and will then have to notify the college in writing of their acceptance. Final decisions cannot be made until after the ballot process is finalized on Wednesday 6th September 2017.
- 7. Payment of \$1000 for Level 'A' scholarship recipients will be credited to an account in the student's name at the college. This fund will then be used for educational purposes for as long as the student is enrolled at One Tree Hill College. This could include the purchase of material fees, school fees, external exam fees, school trips and camps and other educational costs at the discretion of the Principal. Similarly for Level 'B' scholarship recipients, the value of their scholarship will be credited to an account in the student's name at the college.
- 8. All applicants are subject to the One Tree Hill College enrolment scheme (out of zone applicants are still subject to the normal ballot selection process)
