Last week at our annual Sports Prizegiving we celebrated the various sporting successes at the college this year. Like other areas of the college, this year's sporting achievements have been some of the best in our school's 62 year history. Our supreme sporting awards for 2017, Dux Ludorum, were awarded to Pelea Fruean and Joe Elisara. Both these students epitomise elite performance, determination and sportsmanship. Pelea represented New Zealand in boxing at the Youth Commonwealth Games in the Bahamas earlier this year, whilst Joe was selected in the Auckland under 18 rugby
