## Principal's Message



#### **Dear Parents and Caregivers**

Congratulations to our Football Director, Tim Payne, who was recently selected for the All Whites who played Canada in Spain. He was first selected for the All Whites as an 18 year old, and has earnt his position back in the team after an outstanding season as captain of the Eastern Suburbs National League team. Our footballers at One Tree Hill College are very fortunate to be learning from one of our country's best.



I would also like to congratulate all the students who participated at Polyfest. This year the College entered nine cultural groups at the festival including Māori Kapa Haka, Cook Island, Tongan, Samoan, Korean, Filipino, Spanish, Fijian/Indian and Hawaiian groups. All groups performed with distinction and brought a great deal of pride upon themselves and the school.

Four groups in particular were singled out for special commendations. The Spanish group won the European Continent stage and the Hawaiian group won the America Continent stage award. In addition to this, the Cook Island group were not only placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall, but also won 5 other awards, including Year 12 student Denis Tokorangi being placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Cook Island speech competition. Finally, Siesi Katoa won the Year 10 Tongan speech competition. A fantastic effort from these students, as well as all students in all groups.

I would like to acknowledge all the hard work, time and effort from the teachers, tutors, parents and students who make these achievements possible. As always success occurs due to the support of everyone working together.

As you know, success in the classroom often correlates strongly with success in co-curricular activities, like the Polyfest. Last week One Tree Hill College was represented in the following codes at national sports tournaments around the North Island: – baseball in Auckland, softball in Lower Hutt, and volleyball (boys and girls) in Palmerston North. I am proud to inform our community that we were placed  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  in baseball and softball respectively, as well as  $2^{nd}$  and  $12^{th}$  in volleyball division two. I am always impressed by the talent of our students who compete so strongly on the national stage.

- ✓ Payments by instalment should you wish to make weekly/ fortnightly/ monthly payments this can also be done on line, as above, or arranged by signing an "automatic bank payment authority".
