

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Most current <u>bus services</u> in Auckland's Central Suburbs will change from 8 July 2018

The biggest change to Auckland's bus network kicks off in the Central Suburbs on Sunday 8 July 2018 – and we need your help to tell the community!

New bus routes, new route numbers, new timetables are all ready to go. For most people this just means improved bus services. However, some suburbs will have significant changes and users will need to re-plan their journeys. This might include using a new bus stop, a familiar route changing, or needing to transfer to complete a journey.

With most bus services set to change, it is vital that the community know what is happening. We are rolling out a comprehensive information campaign across the Central Suburbs, but we also need the help of community groups and organisations like yours to help spread the word.

What the community needs to know:

- > On Sunday 8 July, **most current bus services** in the Central Suburbs will change as part of the New Network.
- Auckland Transport school buses will change at the start of Term 3, 2018.
- ➤ If you catch buses in these areas, you will need to **re-plan your journey** on the new services before they start on 8 July.
- To do this, visit AT.govt.nz/journeyplanner after 15 June (when the new services are available in the system) enter your journey details, and use a date that is **FROM 8 July**. This will tell you what bus you need to catch, where to catch it, and what time it departs.

NCEA Fees 2018

All Year 11, 12 and 13 students are required to pay one fee of \$76.70 for all NCEA standards assessed in 2018. This amount is due by **4pm, Monday 27 August 2018.**

However, significant financial assistance is available for families who:

- ☐ receive a Work and Income or Study benefit;
- ☐ are eligible for a Community Services Card;
- □ have more than one child entering for NZQA qualifications this year.

By completing a very simple form, this reduces the NCEA fee to \$20 (or \$30 if paying for more than one child in the family). The forms are available from reception. These forms must be returned to the college reception by **Friday 17 August**. Please contact the college reception if you require further information regarding this process.
