Principal's Message



Dear Parents and Caregivers

Thank you to Hināu Whānau who recently led our college 'superstar' mufti-day. All proceeds and non-perishable goods were donated to the Starship Hospital. Just under \$3,000 was raised by students and staff for this very valuable community organisation. Congratulations to all those who donated.

A reminder to parents of senior students. All Year 11, 12 and 13 students are required to pay an annual fee of \$76.70 for all NCEA standards assessed in 2018. This amount is due by 4pm, Monday 27th August. However, significant financial assistance is available for families who:

- receive a Work and Income or Study benefit;
- are eligible for a Community Services Card;
- have more than one child entering for NZQA qualifications this year.

By completing a very simple form, this reduces the NCEA fee to \$20 (or \$30 if paying for more than one child in the family). The forms are available from the reception and are attached to the email version of the newsletter. These forms must be returned to the college reception by Friday 17 August. If you are unsure of your eligibility for NCEA financial assistance, please contact the college receptionist, Mrs Lisa Whiting, who will be only too happy to assist you with your enquiry.

We are now heading into the 'business end' of the year – senior students only have 12 weeks of classes remaining before their external NZQA examinations. It is the time of the year when students can make huge gains towards their levels of achievement and gaining valuable NCEA credits. This does not happen without hard work. I urge all students to ensure they meet all their deadlines and make the most of every moment in class. It will make a difference.

To create further opportunities for students to study, research and complete homework tasks, a supervised homework centre will be available for students from Monday 23 July 2018 operating 4 days per week (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday) from 3:30pm until 4:45pm. During the upcoming school holidays, a supervised study centre will also available for students across all levels. This will be located in the Knowledge Centre, open from 9:15am until 2:30pm every day of the holidays.

There are also a number of holiday workshops taking place within the departments of the school. If your child is involved with any of these workshops, please ensure that they attend as teachers have given up their holiday time to be here at school to help and support students with their studies.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Most current <u>bus services</u> in Auckland's Central Suburbs will change from 8 July 2018

What the community needs to know:

- > On Sunday 8 July, most current bus services in the Central Suburbs will change as part of the New Network.
- > Auckland Transport school buses will change at the start of Term 3, 2018.
- If you catch buses in these areas, you will need to re-plan your journey on the new services before they start on 8 July.
- To do this, visit <u>AT.govt.nz/journeyplanner</u> after 15 June (when the new services are available in the system) enter your journey details, and use a date that is **from 8 July**. This will tell you what bus you need to catch, where to catch it, and what time it departs.
