WINTER SPORTS TOURNAMENT UPDATE

Premier Netball - Mt Maunganui

After comfortably going unbeaten through the first and second round, the team qualified for the top 8 of the Upper North Island Secondary Schools (UNISS) tournament. Then, in two nail-biting games, we lost to New Zealand's top two teams – St Kentigern and Howick College. This has placed the team in a scenario in which they must win their game on the last day on the tournament versus Westlake or Hamilton Girls to qualify for the national tournament to be played in the school holidays in Timaru.

1st XI Boys Football - Papakura

The team continued their excellent form this season and were unbeaten through pool play with 4 wins and 1 draw, qualifying them as winners of their division. In the quarter final they played Rotorua Boys High School and lost 8-7 on penalties. They will now compete for 5th to 8th place.

1st XI Girls Football – Western Springs

The team have competed well and have progressed into the middle section of the tournament in which they won their quarter final 2 - 0 versus Strathallen College. They will play their semi-final against Te Puke High School.

1st XI Girls Hockey – Taupo

The team have also competed well, and following an excellent win against Selwyn College, progressed into the playoffs for 9th to 12th place. In the first of their last two games they will play Cambridge High School.
