Principal's Message



Dear Parents and Caregivers

I would like to extend a warm welcome to our new and returning students and staff. It has been wonderful seeing familiar faces, and meeting our new Year 9 students and their parents. I especially enjoyed the powhiri for our new Year 9 students and their families – starting your secondary schooling is always such a special occasion.

It has been a brilliant start to the year for many reasons. Firstly, NZQA have released our preliminary NCEA results for 2018 and they are outstanding at all three levels. At both level 1 and 2 over 80% of students, and at Level 3 over 73% of students, achieved their respective qualification. Of these students, many achieved their NCEA with either merit or excellence endorsement. All these results are representative of the outstanding teaching and learning taking place at One Tree Hill College. I would like to congratulate both students and teachers alike for their extreme efforts last year to achieve these results.

Scholarship is the pinnacle of achievement to New Zealand secondary schools. This is the ultimate level of achievement and I am very proud to inform our community that in 2018, One Tree Hill College gained 3 Scholarships. I would like to congratulate Sean Kumar who achieved a scholarship in Statistics and Chemistry, and Daisy Boon in Media Studies.

These results are only possible with high quality teachers. In 2019 we welcome new teachers, Ms Raviesha Abeysinghe, Ms Abby Hope, Ms Eunsong Lee, Ms Anne McDonnell, Ms Chez O'Donnell, Mr Tony Patolo, Ms Vicki Squibbs, Mr Ashley Tuia, Ms Danielle van Rossum, Mr Dasun Wagagchchi and Mr David Waters to the college.

As we have done in previous years, we will continue to place significant emphasis on our 'Attitudes to Learning', 'Safe School Charter' and 'School Values' which are fundamental to student success. Two of these attitudes which we have stressed this week have been ensuring all students are on time to school (8:45am) and in the correct uniform. This year there are new bell times (see next page). Please remember that school begins on a Tuesday at 9:15am for a 9:20am start to teaching and learning.

This year we are also enforcing new rules with regards to mobile phone use at the college. Unless under the instruction of a teacher for learning purposes, no mobile phones or head phones are to be used or be visible inside any building at One Tree Hill College.
