Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Caregivers

Welcome back to term 2. Over the holidays our boys' chorale, Esquire, were invited to perform at the ANZAC dawn ceremony at the Auckland War Memorial Museum. They were outstanding. Prior to departing at 5am, the boys gathered around the One Tree Hill College War Memorial to pay their respect to the fallen. Lest we forget.

Yesterday all secondary schools across New Zealand received their confirmed NCEA results for 2018. One Tree Hill College student results were once again outstanding:

OTHC NCEA Level 1:	83%	(national mean 72%)
OTHC NCEA Level 2:	84%	(national mean 77%)
OTHC NCEA Level 3:	76%	(national mean 66%)

On Friday 10 May, we will hold our inaugural Mother-Daughter breakfast. I strongly encourage all our mothers and female caregivers to accompany their daughter for a morning of inspirational speakers and company. Tickets for this event are now on sale and available from the reception and Student Services Centre (adults \$10, students \$5).

We have recently appointed two new Assistant Principals. I wish to congratulate Mrs Christine McKnight and Mr Tim Middleton on their appointment. Mrs McKnight has been the Curriculum Leader of Social Sciences, and Mr Middleton returns to One Tree Hill College from St

Kentigern College. Whilst Mr Middleton transitions back to One Tree Hill College, Ms Crawford and Mr Kumar will continue in acting senior leadership roles.

Senior assessment weeks take place from Monday 27 May to Friday 7 June. There will be bell changes for the whole school during this time. In order to support students at all levels with their studies, the One Tree Hill College Homework Centre will now be open daily, with tutors to assist students with school work, homework, assessments, or their study programmes (more information is attached).

Please remember that this term is often wet and cold. We ask you to ensure your child has the correct school uniform to keep them warm and dry. Jerseys and jackets are available for purchase at the Warehouse, Sylvia Park. Non-regulation alternatives will not be permitted.
