

As has been detailed in previous newsletters, senior assessment weeks take place from Monday 27 May to Friday 7 June. There will be bell changes for the whole school during this time. Outbreak of Measles in Auckland

The Auckland Regional Public Health Service has advised us that the measles virus is circulating in the community. As a precautionary measure, please check your child has immunity either through having received the MMR vaccination, previous measles diagnosis, or by blood serology test. If you wish to know more about the dangers of the measles virus, or how to get your child vaccinated, please contact your doctor or our school nurses.

Senior Assessment Weeks 27 – 30 May and 4 – 7 June

These are weeks in which all senior students are scheduled to complete their course examinations and assessments which count towards their final NCEA grades. All senior students must attend school for the duration of their examinations and assessments. All senior students have received their examination and assessment timetable. Junior students will continue as per normal during this period. Throughout this two week period, bell times will be different to normal.

Please discuss with your child their timetable for the week and ensure they attend when required. I would also like to ask all families to help their children by providing them with a quiet place in the home in which they can study and be prepared for these important assessments. In so many cases these upcoming examinations and assessments will prove essential for your child to achieve their NCEA this year.

School will be Closed due to Industrial Action – Wednesday 29 May

A message from Darryl Follows, Board Chair:

"The PPTA has advised the One Tree Hill College Board of Trustees that teachers at our school will be taking strike action on Wednesday 29 May 2019.

The Board has carefully considered the availability of teaching staff and decided that we cannot provide for the normal teaching services during the strike, so the school will officially be closed for instruction on this day. Accordingly, it's important that you make appropriate alternative arrangements for the care of your child/children on this day as no supervision can be provided. School buses will not be running on 29 May.

I know that this is inconvenient for parents and students alike, but please be assured that student safety is our main concern. Thank you for your understanding. Please contact Mr Coughlan if you have any queries relating to this decision.

As you will understand the overall situation may change quickly should negotiations recommence and we will endeavour to inform parents and caregivers as promptly as possible of any developments."
