The Education Review Office (ERO) is an independent external evaluation agency. ERO provides assurance to the Government about the quality and effectiveness of schools and early childhood services. Most recently, ERO has reported on One Tree Hill College in 2012, 2015 and 2020. Here are some of the highlights from the outstanding 2020 ERO report:
