Principal's Message



Dear Parents and Caregivers

As the term comes to an end, I would like to acknowledge the commitment and resilience of our students. Despite the many obstacles that have been thrown their way this year, they continue to impress. We have recently analysed our progress NCEA data, and in many areas, it is ahead of the same time last year. In NCEA Level 2 and 3 over 90% of our students are on track to achieve. This is simply amazing!

The results described above have been built upon outstanding teaching and learning programmes, both in the classroom and remotely, developed by our teachers. I cannot praise our teachers highly enough for the way in which they have left no stone unturned trying to create the best outcomes for each and everyone of our students. My thanks to all support and teaching staff who work so very hard for our students.

Last Friday, Year 10 students participated in the annual Freedom Challenge event, supported by Amnesty International. Students collaborated in groups to create social actions that raised awareness about human rights that are impacted by climate change. Students focused on many different areas of the world, including Kiribati and Philippines. Year 10 students are now using their experience to write a report for their Social Studies NCEA Starter Programme.

Over a number of years, we have been impressed by the number of students who want to add value to our college, this year is no exception. This year, ten excellent candidates ranging from Year 9 to 12 were nominated to be the next Student Trustee on the Board of Trustees. Today we held the annual election for the Student Trustee on the Board of Trustees for 2020. The Returning Officer, Mrs Eustace, has declared Year 12 student, Felix Nicholls as the newly elected Student Trustee. This year the Board of Trustees have again invited the second placed candidate, Masina Fifita, to attend the meetings in support of the Student Trustee. PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

There are many property modifications that have recently been completed at the college, and there are many more about to begin.

The following projects have been recently completed:

- Hinau Walkway
- New Carpark and Driveway
- Kowhai and Tawa Upper Corridor Re-roofing
- Auditorium Re-roofing
- Hinau Artificial Grass around the pohutakawa tree
- Air Conditioner/Heat Pumps 3 more installed in classrooms.

The following projects are about to begin:

- Canteen Canopy a 14.7m x 7.2m canopy in front of the canteen
- Upper Tawa and Kowhai bifold window replacement
- Upper Tawa and Kowhai Classroom Upgrade these rooms will all be repainted, new whiteboard cabinets added, new wall linings, new flooring, all in addition to the new windows and lighting.
- Food Technology H3 Upgrade
- Hinau and Lower Gymnasium Roofing
- Electrical Upgrade replacement of the upper Tawa lights to LEDs
- Dilution Sink Trap Replacement
- Sports Field Upgrade
- Staffroom Upgrade

There has also been a lot of planting to enhance the college grounds. Over 330 native plants have been planted around the school this term. Vegetable plots have also been planted in planter boxes outside the H11 Food Technology room and by the marae. Vegetables planted include spinach, kale, red cabbage, silver beet, spring onions, radish, carrots, courgette, capsicum, lettuce, celery, leeks, beans, strawberries, cucumber, beetroot, cherry tomatoes and potatoes. These vegetables will all be used in our Food Technology programme, as are the eggs produced by our chickens.

UNIFORM AND PERSONAL GROOMING EXPECTATIONS

All students are expected to abide by the conditions they agreed to when they enrolled at the college. This includes wearing full and correct school uniform, and following the school's expectations on jewellery and personal grooming.
