The Ministry of Education have granted all secondary schools five Teacher Only Days over the next 3 years to work through the changes that will be occurring to NCEA. The first of these days for all Auckland secondary schools is on Thursday 19 November. Please make alternative arrangements for your child to be at home on this day.

STUDENT SUCCESS IN SCIENCE

This year we have four students who have been selected for very significant opportunities in Science.

Iele Ieremia has been awarded a place at the MacDiarmid Institute, Discovery Camp. This a fully funded week based at the MacDiarmid Science Research Institute with only 15 places for students nationwide. Students gain lab experience with top scientists into a range of topics including electron microscopy, laser physics and nano-electronics.

Roy Rogers and Bree Felton were awarded places at the Rotary Science Forum run by Rotary NZ. This is a two week residential forum where students are exposed to recent developments in Science, Mathematics & Technology. Students visit laboratories and field stations of tertiary institutes in Auckland.

Linh Ngo has been awarded a place at Otago University's Science Academy (OUASSA) is designed to introduce potentially high achieving Year 13 students to cutting edge research by means of practical projects held over two 5-day residential science camps and online support through their Virtual Academy. OUASSA introduces the students to the world of science research, students gain practical skills, learn how to communicate science, and be familiar with the range of career options open to scientists.

NEW OTHC PE UNIFORM

In 2021 students in PE will be required to wear a new PE uniform. The new uniform will be in our traditional school colours, as well as reflect our other sports uniforms. The uniform will also be able to be used by students when competing in many other sporting codes. The feedback from students who have been trialling the new clothing is that is more comfortable, fits better for both boys and girls, can be worn for other activities, and looks awesome! The new PE uniform will be ordered through the school at a price similar to our current PE uniform – more details to follow.
