#### YEAR 9 & 10 STUDENTS RETURN TO SCHOOL - MONDAY 22 NOVEMBER

On Monday we welcome back our Year 9 & 10 students to onsite learning. We have robust health and safety provisions in place for students and staff. A reminder all students must wear face masks to/from school, and whilst at school.

We have made some slight adjustments to the bell times (attached). School will finish at 3.00pm each day. School will start at 9.00am each morning, except Mondays and Wednesdays when students will attend whānau class at 8.45am. All students will receive a new printed timetable in whānau class on Monday morning. On Monday (Day 6) students will arrive at school by 8.45am and will go directly to their whānau class for a special Health and Safety briefing and to be welcomed back to school by their Whānau Teacher.

Students will be required to bring a laptop and all other equipment required for lessons. Laptops will be required every day. Students must wear full school uniform – the Warehouse Sylvia Park is open if new items are required.

## NZQA NCEA EXAMINATIONS – SENIOR STUDENTS

NZQA Examinations begin for Year 11, 12 and 13 students on Monday 22 November. All senior students must attend their respective examinations as per the timetable – go to <a href="https://www.nzqa.govt.nz">www.nzqa.govt.nz</a>

Senior students must attend their examinations in full school uniform.

Senior students coming onsite for examinations must wear a face mask and go directly to their allocated examination room and wait outside until they are allowed to enter. At the conclusion of their examination, students must go straight home. For safety reasons, students cannot remain onsite.

Senior students attending organised tutorials must follow the same instructions as detailed above.

### **OTHC PE UNIFORM**

In 2022 <u>ALL</u> students in PE will be required to wear the new PE uniform. The new uniform is in our traditional school colours, and reflects our other sports uniforms. The uniform will be able to be used by students when competing in many other sporting codes. The feedback from students who have been wearing the new clothing this year is that is more comfortable, fits better for both boys and girls, can be worn for other activities, and looks awesome! The PE uniform can be ordered through the school website. The old light blue PE uniform cannot be worn next year.
